## Remembering Wayne Lemons

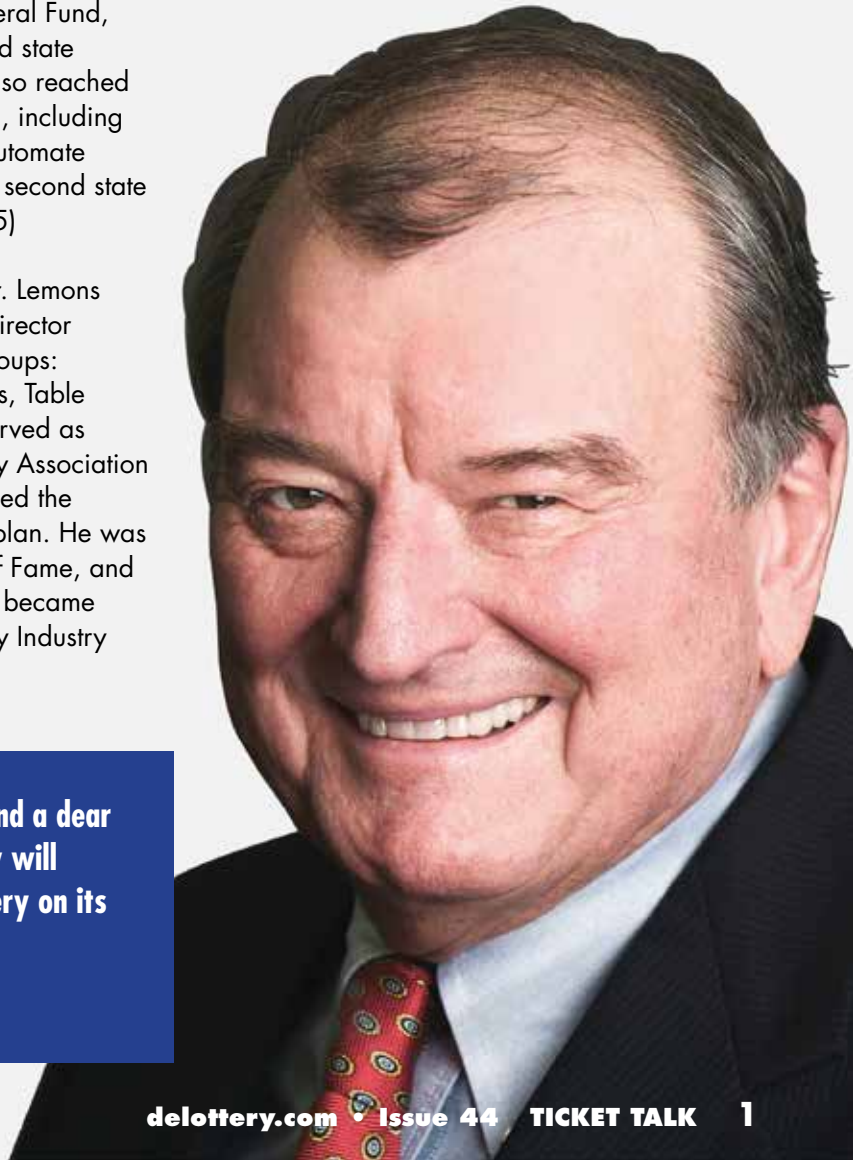
1931-2014

Wayne Lemons, our former director who led the Delaware Lottery for 20 years (1991-2011), passed away in June. Under Mr. Lemons' astute leadership and guidance, the Delaware Lottery grew substantially since its inception in 1975, giving more than \$3.9 billion to date to the State's General Fund, which helps finance much needed state services. The Delaware Lottery also reached many milestones under his watch, including becoming the first state to fully automate Lottery drawings (1998) and the second state to implement Video Lottery (1995)

Mr. Lemons' dedication, commitment and contribution to the Delaware Lottery are immeasurable. We remain ever grateful to him for his 20 years of service.

A testament to his endeavors, Mr. Lemons was the only U.S. State Lottery Director to oversee four major product groups: Traditional Games, Video Games, Table Games and Sports Lottery. He served as President of the Multi-State Lottery Association (MUSL) during which he supervised the development of its first strategic plan. He was later elected to the Lottery Hall of Fame, and in September 2011, Mr. Lemons became the second recipient of the Lottery Industry Statesmen Award.

## RETAILERS CELEBRATING 20 YEARS

### **BJ's WHOLESALE CLUB #15 - NC**

Butch McCracken, Store Manager of BJ's Wholesale Club #15, said the Lottery is definitely a draw and has created repeat foot traffic for their location. He added that over the years the process of selling lottery games has become easier and faster.



### **DAILY MARKET**

**Brad Alwood and Tim Wallace, owners**

Brad Alwood and Tim Wallace teamed up and purchased the Daily Market in Lewes more than 20 years ago. The store was an existing Lottery agent and they logically decided to keep the product line to see how it would perform for them. That decision paid off as lottery volume skyrocketed and the Daily Market became the number one overall retailer in Sussex County and the number one Instant ticket Retailer in the State of Delaware. They've also sold many winning tickets over the past 20 years. Twice they had \$100,000 POWERBALL winners who missed hitting the jackpot by the Powerball number itself.



Brad stated that his favorite current lottery game is KENO, because it's fast-paced and you know if you are a winner within four minutes. The Daily Market is one of a handful of lottery agents who sell Traditional Games, Keno and Sports Lottery. Brad would like to see the state offer a range of \$30 to \$50 Instant Games and to look at changing prize structures within games to keep his players interested for a long time to come.

### **DAVE'S LIQUORS**

**Vijay and Bhavna Patel, owners**

Vijay Patel and his wife Bhavna bought Dave's Liquors in 1992, and soon thereafter sought to establish lottery as a staple product in their store. And they did a splendid job elevating the lottery to the forefront of their business. Dave's soon became the most popular destination for lottery in the city of New Castle. Located in close proximity to the Delaware Memorial Bridge, and even closer to the off-ramp of Interstate 495, Dave's Liquors capitalized on the frenzy created by POWERBALL in the '90s as residents from neighboring states poured into Delaware because it was the only Mid-Atlantic lottery that sold the game.



Vijay said there are two keys to growing and maintaining strong lottery sales, top-notch customer service, and the means to readily

cash all winning tickets—no matter what. The daily numbers games—Play 3 and Play 4—are very important to the customers of Dave's Liquors, therefore Vijay and Bhavna are always prepared to cash these tickets and celebrate with their customers the frequent winning experiences that keep bringing players into the store. Vijay and Bhavna re-modeled and expanded their store in 2009 to keep pace with demand and to stock and display a greater variety of products. Now the store is positioned to continue its success for many more years with lottery continuing to be a focal point.

### **EDGEMOOR LIQUOR**

**Rajendra Modi, owner and Dru Modi** *(pictured)*

Edgemoor Liquors is owned and operated by the father and son team of Rajendra and Dru Modi. Dru said that because of the Lottery, the business has become an integral part of the community of Edgemoor. He and his father would not have developed the personal relationships they have with numerous longtime residents of the area had it not been for the lottery. Many of the store's lottery players are elderly, as is his father, and the personal connections Rajendra has made with his lottery customers have been cemented by the generational bonds that are formed by shared life experiences and wisdom gained over mature lifetimes. Lottery players, and in fact most customers of Edgemoor Liquors, are known by name to this father and son duo and they keep coming back because of consistent, honest prices and the personal touch. Raj said he knows his lottery customers so well that when he posts the daytime drawing results for Play 3 and Play 4, he knows which players will be cashing a winning ticket with him later that afternoon.



### **MINQUADALE LIQUORS**

**Pepe Patel, owner; Rajesh and Hemant Patel, managers** *(pictured)*

Minquadale Liquors, managed by Rajesh and Hemant Patel and owned by Pepe Patel, has been a lottery hotspot for 20+ years under their stewardship. The interior of the store was recently re-modeled to better serve its loyal clientele and provide additional display space. The lottery area got a facelift too, with new instant ticket dispensers and a new play station. The Lottery always has been and will continue to be featured prominently at Minquadale Liquors. According to Rajesh, his customers wouldn't have it any other way. "All the lottery games are popular here," he said.



Rajesh also points out that most of his regular customers play lottery more than three times a week. Others, he says, rarely leave without playing lottery, even if it's only one ticket. With plenty of parking, service with a smile, and a convenient location on the DuPont Highway just south of Wilmington, Minquadale Liquors aims to build on its tradition of strong focus and performance on behalf of the region's lottery players.

## REHOBOTH CIGARETTE OUTLET

Mark Hardesty and Dave Smith celebrated 20 years with the Delaware Lottery. Mark said he feels as though the lottery has been a natural product at their Tobacco outlet. He recalled the days before surrounding states had Powerball and his lottery sales accounted for a larger part of the business. Mark and Dave remain very involved at the store despite adding outlets in the area over the past 20 years.



## VANDEVER FOOD MARKET

Jin Choi, owner and Soon Choi,  
owner (pictured)

Jin and Soon Choi, the husband and wife team who own and operate Vandever Market, have a long and happy relationship with the neighborhood they serve. This corner store in Wilmington's East Side community has thrived for a little over 20 years as a friendly place to buy hot and cold foods as well as numerous convenience items. Their customers will tell you that no one knows lottery in the neighborhood better than the Choi family. All Instant Games and winning experiences (in the form of pay receipts) are displayed proudly and prominently here. Play 3 and Play 4 are the "bread and butter" lottery products at Vandever Food Market. But all games receive the attention of Soon. She always greets her regular lottery customers with a smile and lively chatter before getting down to the business of printing their ticket requests. Jin handles the deli counter, but he also spends time behind the lottery terminal and is no less engaged than Soon in making sure that lottery customers get special attention.

Rupinder and Inderjeet said one of the many things they like about the Delaware Lottery is that it feels like a family, from the field reps and tel-sel, to the techs and management. Offering lottery creates foot traffic and they receive repeat business from customers who only want to play at their store. Rupinder and Inderjeet also noted the improvements they've seen with the Delaware Lottery over the years. The process of selling lottery is faster and easier. These improvements help with the busier traffic flows they experience when MEGA MILLIONS and POWERBALL reach \$500-\$600 million. But they said their favorite games are still Play 3 and Play 4 (day and night).



### 7-ELEVEN - Delaware Ave and 7-Eleven - Elkton Rd Anwar Aziz, Franchisee and Hassan Kahwja, Clerk

"Lottery creates foot traffic and repeat business for our location, and Lottery players will buy other things from the store," Anwar said. He also told us that his favorite games are POWERBALL, MEGA MILLIONS and HOT LOTTO.



### BRANDYWINE VILLAGE LIQUORS Pravin A. Patel, owner

Pravin A. Patel, along with his wife Alka, has owned and managed Brandywine Village Liquors since 2001. Pravin said he knows an opportunity when he sees one. Having sold lottery in New York State for 10 years at various retail locations before moving his family to Delaware, he wanted the opportunity to sell lottery in his Wilmington store because he saw firsthand how popular lottery had become in the Empire State. In February 2003, Pravin sold his first Delaware Lottery ticket at Brandywine Village Liquors and the rest, as they say, is history. And history is on display all around him in Brandywine Village, one of the oldest urban settlements in Delaware, and one of Wilmington's most important neighborhoods for commerce in the Colonial era and beyond.



Pravin said his lottery customers are very loyal to him because he knows their preferences and never keeps them waiting. He has several lottery customers he sees every day, seven days a week, because he provides personal, reliable service they can count on. He never turns away anyone with a winning ticket, he said, and this makes him a popular figure in the Village.

### CHESTNUT RUN LIQUORS Ghanshym Patel (pictured) and Vinodray Patel, owners

In a busy shopping center at the intersection of Route 141 and Faulkland Road, one can find Ghanshym Patel and his partner Vinodray Patel working behind the counter at Chestnut Run Liquors. The pair began selling lottery at the store a little more than 10 years ago after a Thriftway Supermarket in the shopping center suddenly closed. Thriftway had been a longtime lottery retailer and its demise left players searching for another location to purchase tickets. Chestnut Run Liquors came to the rescue and filled the lottery void for local shoppers. The partners said they do not always see eye-to-eye on everything, but they do agree that the lottery has been good for their business, cushioning economic recessions and helping to attract new customers from within the shopping center and beyond. The partners are very strong promoters of lottery and their players enjoy only the best in customer service and friendly assistance at Chestnut Run Liquors.





## CONCORD NEWS

**Sara and Ram Pasupuleti, owners**

Sara and Ram Pasupuleti of Concord News have become much-loved members of the lottery retailer community. This delightful couple always has something thoughtful to say, according to their lottery sales representative Don Williams. "They're always thinking of and devising better ways to communicate with our customers and to make lottery stand out in the crowd of products that compete for attention in the Concord Mall," Williams said. Ram is the 'marketing department' and Sara is the 'operations arm' of this small convenience store located within the Concord Mall in North Wilmington.



Ram wants his customers to experience the surprise and thrill of winning and the fun that ensues after good luck strikes. "Good luck never announces itself," Ram said. "It comes without warning or portent, and this makes it all the more appealing." He enjoys helping to make the winning feeling materialize and having the potential every day to make wishes come true for his customers. Ram and Sara recently made room for our newest product, Keno. They have high hopes that the game will attract new shoppers to Concord News and make playing lottery even more entertaining for everyone.

## CORNER LIQUOR STORE

C.K. Patel has been a Lottery agent at this location for more than 10 years. His primary reason for bringing lottery to his store was for customer convenience. C.K. recalled selling a \$90,000 and a \$40,000 winning ticket in the past 10 years. When asked what his favorite Lottery game was, he told us he usually purchases a single ticket when Powerball exceeds \$200 million.



C.K. said they're currently in the planning stage of building a new store on the property and will tear down the current store for additional parking. He said that after he expands he would like to become one of the state's many Sports Lottery retailers.

## EZ CHECK FOOD STORE

Jaimini and her husband Ubhay understand that offering lottery products to your customers is a win-win for your business; they own several retail establishments and sell lottery products in all of them. They attribute their success with lottery to having a good relationship with the customers—they even know the numbers their regular customers play. Ubhay vividly recalls the \$1 million winner from their store on October 17, 2012. The customer handed him a stack of tickets to check and didn't even know she had won. "From that point on, customers thought we were the winning store," said Ubhay.



## HARRINGTON RACEWAY & CASINO

Many changes have transpired in the 10-plus years that Harrington Raceway & Casino has offered traditional Lottery in their gift shop. Perhaps the biggest occurred when the casino expanded and changed its name from Midway Slots to Harrington Raceway & Casino. During the expansion, the gift shop was relocated twice until they landed in the current location on the gaming floor near the main entrance. The Gift Shop staff has been our retailing partner at the State Fair for many years, and this year extended our partnership to the new Triple Threat Beer, Bar-B-Que and Wine Festival in the spring.



## HESS EXPRESS – New Castle

Offering the lottery has brought in more business and created regular customers according to Greg and JoJo. They also feel that the entire process of selling Lottery has become faster and easier over the years.

This blend of new and old provides a steady stream of regular customers within walking distance from the surrounding neighborhoods and easy automobile access via Maryland Avenue for more distant City residents and office workers. The Patels have created a friendly atmosphere in which lottery players feel welcome. Players know they can count on fast and accurate service when buying tickets or cashing their winners.



## LINCOLN SMOKE SHOP

Lincoln Smoke Shop has been a destination for lottery players for almost forty years. The



store's current owner, Harry Patel, knew he was buying a famous lottery location when, a little more than ten years ago, he decided to invest in this large corner property in Wilmington's Little Italy neighborhood. Harry worked hard to deliver the expert service lottery players have come to expect from Lincoln Smoke Shop, and his hard work has paid dividends. The store is surrounded by a vital retail and residential district that sports many restaurants, bars, bakeries, and shops selling a wide range of specialties. Sub shops abound and some of the best Italian ice in the Western world is made right in this neighborhood. When his youngest daughter graduates, the Singhs are planning to retire. Their daughter has been a participant in XFingers and she is looking forward to one more contest next year before she graduates from college.
